

Dr. Brosens studied Molecular Biology and Medicine in Amsterdam. Subsequent he did a PhD at the University of Utrecht on clinical and molecular aspects gastrointestinal polyposis syndromes. Hereafter he started residency in Pathology followed by gastrointestinal pathology fellowships at in the AMC in Amsterdam and a post-doctoral research fellowship in the Sol Goldman Pancreatic Cancer Research Center at Johns Hopkins (Baltimore, USA).

Since 2015, he works as a dedicated gastrointestinal and endocrine pathologist in the UMC Utrecht and RadboudUMC (Nijmegen) and leads the gastrointestinal and neuroendocrine pathology research group in the UMC Utrecht. His current research mainly focusses on the (epi)genetics pancreatic neuroendocrine tumors and how to exploit this for patient stratification. He has served in many national and international expert working groups, guideline committees, and advisory boards and (co)authored chapters 5th edition in the WHO Classification of Tumours series (Digestive System Tumors and Tumours Endocrine and Neuroendocrine tumours).
